She started her teaching career as a teacher of Spanish as a foreign language at Salamanca University and continued in the United Kingdom as a Language Assistant. Back in Spain, she taught English as a foreign language at the Official School of Languages in Santander, where she held the position of Headteacher for 12 years. In 2016 she was appointed Education Adviser for the Spanish Embassy Education Office, with responsibilities in the North of England, based in Manchester. When not working, she likes playing and cooking with her 8-year-old twins, any room in Carmen's house can become a Spanish stage!

Description

There are many connections between being an MFL teacher and acting on stage. Foreign language practice and drama games also share common objectives: they stimulate creativity, motivation and improvisation, they improve body language, voice projection and intonation and they help develop self-confidence and awareness of others. In this workshop we explore a few drama games, resources, magic props and activities for making things (with paper), all with an 'element of surprise' in them, with a 'small dose of 'magic', as a way to keep up our pupils' joy of learning. The examples used in the workshop are Spanish but the session will be delivered in English, so activities can be easily adapted to other languages.
