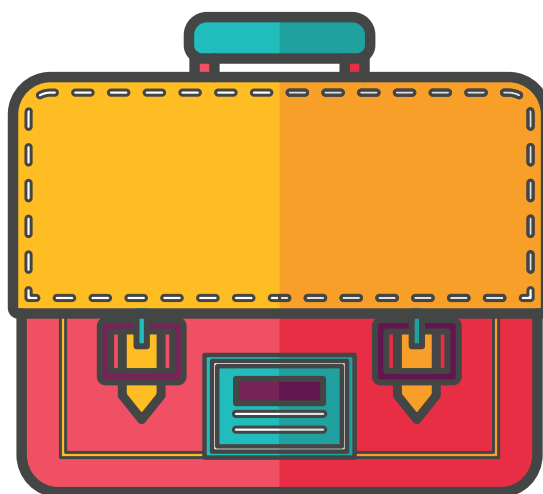
Jamie and Lisa's story

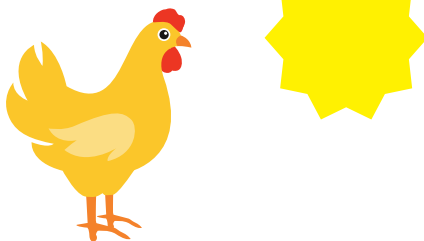
Fair Trade coffee pack

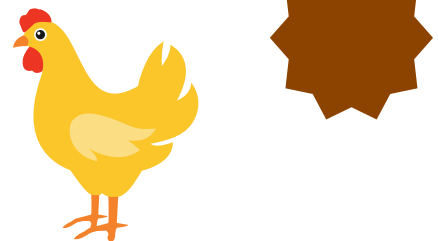
'Value' chicken

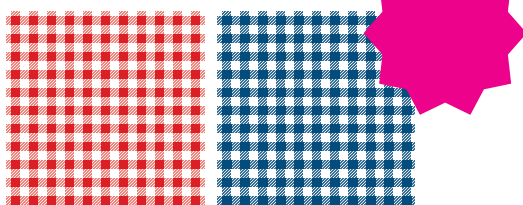
Fair Trade chocolate bar

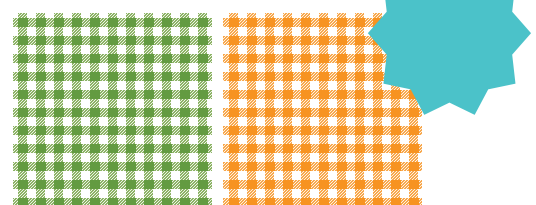
Drying up cloths
