

Keynote Presentations:

Key Visuals in Scaffolding Language Across the Curriculum with Andy Harvey – Live Webinar, Friday 2nd October am

This session focuses on the use of Key Visuals in scaffolding language across the curriculum. It includes a framework for planning the language of a topic and how Key Visuals can be used to support this planning. The session will include some practical examples of how Key Visuals can be used in relation to the language planning framework.

Workshop on the Use of Key Visuals to Aid learning with Andy Harvey – Thursday 8th October pm

This session explores practical ways in which Key Visuals can be used to support speaking and listening, reading comprehension and writing.

An overview of the work of Pauline Gibbons, including Setting up Students for Success in Writing by Steve Cooke – Friday 2nd October am

This session will begin with considering the nature of effective scaffolding and then moves on to apply these principles to the teaching of writing. Sometimes known as the 'teaching and learning cycle', the scaffolding involves a number of stages in the writing process: modelling the field, mode ling the text type, joint construction of text, individual writing, and self-editing. Steve Cooke will summarise Pauline's presentation and work.

More about Andy Harvey

Andy has worked in the field of EAL for over 20 years and was the Deputy Head of the Hounslow EAL Team. In his work for Hounslow Language Service Ltd (HLS Ltd), Andy provides Certificated EAL training such as LILAC courses (Language in Learning across the Curriculum). This year, he has delivered conferences, seminars and school-based workshops across the country on a wide range of EAL issues. In the last 3 years, Andy has delivered training in a number of universities and colleges in the UK, Turkey, India, China and Singapore. He is constantly creating new materials and courses at the cutting edge of his specialist work.



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More about Steve Cooke

Steve has worked in the field of EAL teaching since 1982 in primary and secondary schools in London, Rochdale and Leicester. He has also been an EAL Project Manager for Leicester City, a Regional Adviser for the National Strategies and an Achievement Consultant for Nottingham City. Most recently he was a recognised lecturer and distance learning tutor for the University of Birmingham MEd. in Bilingualism in Education. He has carried out CPD for over 30 different local authorities in the UK and has presented workshops in the Netherlands, France, Germany, Russia and Pakistan. He has written articles for books and journals and is the author of *Collaborative Learning Activities in the Classroom*.
