

Resources for Letters and Sounds

Introduction

Ensuring resources, such as words, GPC's (grapheme-phoneme correspondences) and and sound charts (technically a grapheme grid) are matched to Letters and Sounds is crucial for fidelity and consistency.

Carefully selecting resources that are aligned to letters and sounds teaching order so children can successfully blend and segment will greatly aid application, progress and programme success.

Grapheme grids (sound friezes for classroom wall)

Where should the wall class sound charts best displayed?

- Sound charts or technically 'grapheme grids' displayed as each phoneme is introduced.
- At child's height
- Use to read and say the sounds in your daily revise and review.
- Positioned near teaching area.
- Phase 5: Point to 'same, sound BUT different spelling.' For example, 'ou- a mouse in a house.' You can quickly point to 'ow' (phase3).
- Consistency. Have the same grapheme grids in all classrooms.
- For SEND have the same grapheme grids in the writing area.

Should I use sound charts with images?

- Picture clues are extremely helpful to engage, aid memorisation and support EAL children, and struggling readers.
- SEN children benefit from visual prompts and images to aid their recall and retention.
- Images are also effective in aiding 'tuning in' when introducing a new sound.

Does the type of font matter?

- Ensure fonts match your handwriting scheme (cursive/non-cursive).
- Using the same font for wall charts, tricky words and words aids consistency.
- Using the same font for grapheme grids and words also helps children with SEND and handwriting skills.
- Handwriting and pencil grip visual reminders with a variety of writing tools are helpful too in the writing area. Alongside a variety of tools, paper, envelopes, etc.



What sound charts are useful in the writing area and setting?

- For application, grapheme grids (same as displayed on the wall) in the writing area are helpful to support independence.
- Lots of repeated practise of saying, matching and having a go at writing sounds and words, supported by the use of objects and sound charts with images.
- Tricky words in red- stop! Careful, these are tricky! Tricky words in view and accessible aid learning also and open up on the spot teaching opportunities.
- As children progress give children choice- grapheme grids with images as clue (a- apple) and later in the year, also offer charts with just the graphemes so children do not become dependent on the image/action.

Why?

Exact L& S order Reasonable price Sturdy, double sided (one side the word, the other sound buttons – less able/more able support) Good images to use as memory hook- ppppig, hhhhorse. Opportunites to add actions too. Warning: Need to add more coplex, challenging words for higher ability.





This frieze represents the Phase Two phonemes of Letters and Sounds in the progression that they are introduced, along with photographic mnemonic images. The frieze comes in a box so the phonemes that have not yet been taught can be stored until introduced

*Note: May not be a mnemonic. It may be an action to match the image, i.e 'a'- 'apple' (so use gesture to mime eating an **a**pple) Gesture & actions are powerful effective memory tools.

<u>Actions and images</u>: These images alongside actions to ensure engagement, memorisation and participation, may be useful to support the introduction of a phoneme <u>alongside</u> tuning them in as step one of introducing a new phoneme.

Double sided with one side showing sound buttons and the other side, just the word. Thick card so easy to handle and sturdy. *They have a degree of progression in the word complexity but perhaps <u>not quite challenging</u> enough if you have higher ability.




Smart Kids do Chute cards, that focus on one particular phoneme. Good for small group booster work to address key gaps.



What can I use for the daily revise and review plus catch up?

This grid is really clear, aids EAL children but isn't overwhelming. Phase 6 + key stage 2 (ideal for consolidating phase 5 advanced code and year2+)




A useful wall chart (grapheme grid) to rapidly read the phonemes then immediately blend to read words!

A good resource for a quick daily revise and review to start a catch up lesson in year 2 and key stage two because you can blend to read the example words on the chart.

Note: not all the code is here- a-e e-e i-e o-e u-e and the 5 vowels a e i o u are essential too.




Phase 2 Phonics GPC Chart








A clear and useful grapheme grid for Phase 2 and 3 (reception) Easy gesture/actions to do alongside to aid interaction.

Teach the different sounds and spellings of the 44 sounds in the English Language with this tactile set of plastic object pieces.

Each tub has items representing a particular sound, helping children see real life examples of how different spellings can create the same sound. Covers initial sounds, long and short vowels and split digraphs.

The tubs can be accessed in a structured format, introducing only the relevant sounds that are being taught, making them suitable for whole class phonics teaching. They can also be used for assessment and revision of sounds in a fun and informal way. There is a label on each tub so all items can be replaced into the correct container.
