Do you need a flu vaccination for your employees?

Flu is a highly infectious and very common viral illness that is spread by coughs and sneezes. It's not the same as the common cold. Flu is caused by a different group of viruses and symptoms tend to be more severe and last for longer. Flu symptoms can make you feel so exhausted and unwell that you have to stay in bed and rest until you feel better.

Getting vaccinated not only protects you from the flu virus, but also reduces the risk of you spreading flu citizens, colleagues and family members. This is still important in a year where flu and Covid 19 will be circulating together.

In order to be prepared for the flu season this year, the Employee Wellbeing Team is asking you to inform us of the number of vouchers you require.

This year we are able to offer flu vouchers for £12.00 at Boots pharmacies. The vouchers are electronic and can be emailed or sent via text to the employees – or if preferred, we can send them as a batch to your named point of contact. If you would prefer them to be sent out directly to individuals, please let us know and we will send you details of how to arrange this.

Due to the unprecedented demand last year, we have already ordered a number of vouchers which are ready to be released. If your members of staff require a vaccination, please send an email to the Employee Wellbeing Team entitled Flu Vouchers along with your school contact details and the amount you require, and how you wish us to send to you (see above) by 13th October to ensure we can meet your order. Vouchers are now available to release.

The vouchers can be used at most Boots pharmacies, and they currently have good appointment availability. In terms of booking, there's three ways this can be done.

- 1. Follow the link on the voucher and enter voucher code on the last page (just below the box to enter personal address) to book electronically.
- 2. The employee can contact their local Boots pharmacy over the phone or by dropping in with a copy of their voucher.
- 3. Call the main customer service centre on 0345 0708090 option 3 and then option 1 and they can book the appointment over the phone.
