#### **ATTEND Training to Support Attendance**

The next ATTEND training will take place on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> January 1-3pm via MS teams. The ATTEND framework offers schools a graduated response to meeting the needs of children and young people who are finding it difficult to attend school. It is a collaborative program that aims to elicit the views of the child, parents and school, to form a meaningful action plan based on identified needs. The training will be led by Dr Maddi Popoola (MHST) and Dr Hannah Want (EPS), and is free to Nottingham City schools. ## Israel/Gaza Conflict - Support for Headteachers Briefing

In response to a number of requests from schools for support on handling the local implications of the current conflict in the Middle East, Counter Terrorism Policing's local Prevent Team are running two separate Teams briefings for Headteachers or their nominees. The first session took place on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> December, but the next one will be taking place on **Tuesday 19th December 2-2.30pm** (the content for both sessions is the same so if you attended on 12<sup>th</sup> December then you don't need to attend the session on 19<sup>th</sup> December).

The briefing will be an overview of the current situation in Israel/Palestine, its impact on community sentiments and its potential to be a radicalising influence in the UK. It will give Head Teachers an opportunity to raise any concerns they have. As well as being aware of the risk of young people being radicalised, it is important to balance concerns against an individual's freedom of expression and right to protest so the session will give an opportunity to discuss thresholds for Prevent referrals to ensure a consistent and proportionate response from partners.
