Attached is a flyer which gives details about the Supporting Families project, delivered by Nottingham and District Citizens Advice.

The project is in place for families with children under 18 in Nottingham City, Gedling, and Rushcliffe. Parents are able to book a one-hour appointment to discuss completely confidentially a range of issues including benefits advice, energy efficiency and bill assistance, employment guidance, family matters, income maximisation, housing issues, consumer support and if appropriate, referral to more specialist debt advice. Initially, the contact is by telephone when their issues and possible solutions are discussed.
