
#### Jenny Moseley Foundation Training at Mellers – 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> February

Is anyone interested in joining some really excellent CPD focusing on:

- how to structure and deliver a successful, impactful circle time as part of wellbeing work. This will involve observing a circle time with KS1 and KS2
- how to develop children's oracy and listening skills

Those of us that are old enough might remember Jenny Mosley, who was the national guru at the time for all things wellbeing and emotional health. She's running a full day of workshops at Mellers on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> February 2024 for teaching staff and Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> February 2024 for middays, focusing on positive and calmer lunchtimes.
