We're delighted to invite you to the 'Teaching for Creativity Launch and Celebration event' with <u>Creativity Collaboratives</u> and <u>ChalleNGe Nottingham</u> on Friday 20th September, 2-4pm at Broadway cinema.

Over the last 3 years, 12 schools within Nottingham Schools Trust have established a Community of Practice to explore innovative approaches to Teaching for Creativity, focusing on how to nurture children's innate creative capacity and sustain their curiosity about the world.

Collaborating with Nottingham-based arts partners and creative practitioners, we've seen inspiring, impactful and creative practice: from children developing resilience and problem-solving as they use squishy circuits and crumble kits in design and technology to exploring fairytales through dressing up, role play, movement, sculpting and mask-making. Schools have developed creative approaches to supporting children's mental health, wellbeing, behaviour, and inclusion, ameliorating some of the crises that the school sector – and the 2024 elected government – are preparing to tackle. By nurturing creativity and curiosity in our schools, we can lead the way to a brighter, fairer education system.

Please join us on **Fri 20**th **September**, from **2-4pm** at Broadway to hear from Rebecca Gittins, Headteacher at Welbeck Primary, along with other school leaders involved in the programme. Expectations and Commitments from the School

- Allow MA TESOL students to spend a full day at your school.
 - We anticipate up to 5 students will attend on one day. They can stay as one group and for the observations and will deliver one language lesson together.
 - An NTU member of staff to accompany the students while they are at your school
- Attach students to classes for observation across different subjects during the day.
- Manage pupil behaviour during the free language lesson the students deliver.
- Students can bring their own lunch, or if school can provide lunch, it would all add to the experience!
