ABLE Masterclass for SBMs on Subject Access Requests

The next ABLE Business Masterclass is taking place on Wednesday 21st May, 9.00am to 12.15pm, at Strelley Hall, and the topic is Subject Access Requests. Here are some further details from ABLE:

School subject access requests can feel overwhelming for a busy school DPO. But the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) has made it clear: organisations must comply with subject access requests (SARs) and make sure that senior leadership engages with the need to comply. This in-depth SARS masterclass will give you all the tools you need to get control of SARs, particularly as the number of requests tends to increase towards the end of the academic year. Claire Archibald, award-winning data protection in education lawyer at Browne Jacobson LLP will give you all the tools and guidance you need to gain knowledge and confidence in dealing with SARS including:

- How to recognise a request
- Understanding parental and child rights, and how these may differ
- Requests from employees and governors
- What constitutes a 'reasonable' request and what to do if the request is unreasonable
- Carrying out searches
- Requests for CCTV footage
- Redacting information
- Using information from SARs to drive a more proactive approach to compliance.
