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Citizens Advice Nottingham - Advice First Aid Courses

We would like to offer Nottingham City organisations, groups and charities the opportunity to partner with us to make information and advice as accessible as possible to the people in our local community.

The project is called Advice First Aid. Following a pilot at the start of the year, we have now secured additional funding and we are running a number of free courses up to April 2026.

So what is Advice First Aid?

Advice First Aid aims to ensure that as many people as possible in our local community have access to the support, information and advice that they need, when they need it. You can join us in this aim by enrolling your frontline staff and volunteers on one of our free, three-hour Advice First Aid Courses.

Once trained, Advice First Aiders will be able to:

- Identify the advice needs of members of the public
- Support people, where possible, to find the information they need in order to deal with their problem themselves
- Give guidance on how to access further support from Citizens Advice, if needed
- · Refer those most in need directly into our service

How do you Benefit from Advice First Aid?

By attending one of the courses, your frontline workers will be able to actively support your service users with problems. Advice First Aiders will also be able to refer people to us for advice if their problem is not resolved by Advice First Aid alone.

We will keep in touch with Advice First Aiders after the training, to ensure they feel supported. Our vision is to develop a community of Advice First Aiders across Nottingham City, building relationships across organisations and with us.

Previous Courses

During the pilot, a large proportion of attendees were SENCO and family support workers from primary schools. A number of attendees were also from food banks. But the course is suitable for any group, organisation or charity that works with the public in Nottingham. Feedback from the pilot has been positive and comments from people who attended the course include:

- "Excellent, informative and created a lovely atmosphere"
- "Really good to know how to use the website"
- "Covered a wide but manageable range"
- "Extremely well planned and delivered"

Advice First Aid Courses

The course is three hours, and no pre-course work is necessary – just a desire to help others and make a difference.

We currently have places on the following courses in Nottingham Central Library:

- Monday 21 July from 1pm to 4pm
- Friday 15 August from 10am to 1pm
- Monday 8 September from 1pm to 4pm
